The past several years the kids have been walking through the bible using the SuperBook Series, which gave the kids a visual account of those popular bible stories. The clearances needed to volunteer are State Police Criminal and Child Abuse clearances. They can be done online at https://www.dhs.pa.gov/KeepKidsSafe/Clearances/Pages/default.aspx.

If you prefer to fill out your clearances and mail them in, I have provided an easy way to do this. I have printed out the forms and provided the mailing address already filled out on the envelope. TAX SAVINGS GIVING FOR SENIORS

Are you 70 ½ or older?

Did you know you can donate directly from your IRA or 401K to TUMC? The gift can count as your required minimum distribution (RMD) and is not taxable if you follow the rules for qualified charitable distribution. Direct contributions keep the distribution out of your taxable income so it's a benefit to those who don't itemize. It can also save money for itemizers because an IRA/401K payout that doesn't show up on the tax return can't increase your adjusted gross income. Your adjusted gross income controls how much of your Social Security benefits are taxed and whether you're subject to the high-income surcharge on Medicare premiums.




